

**OFFICIAL TRAIL.**

Wm. McMillan of the Industrial School  
Surrendered to the White Capturing  
Knave.

William C. McMillan, an officer at  
the Vermont Industrial School in Ver-  
gennes, was shot in the leg Wednesday  
afternoon of last week by Frank  
Ladd, a 16-year-old inmate of the  
school committed from St. Johnsbury,  
and, disagreeably wounded, while re-  
turning to the institution Ladd and  
two other boys who had escaped from  
the school's playground.

The discovery that the boys were  
missing was made about four o'clock  
in the afternoon, and a search was  
immediately started by Mr. McMillan,  
at once started in pursuit of the run-  
aways.

McMillan also discovered  
the boys about a mile from the  
school, hidden in a covey of bushes on  
Henry Day's farm, not adjoining the  
school farm. They were ordered to  
come out and line up in order of  
height, the tallest, Edward Sorrell, in  
the lead, Ladd next and Estange last,  
with the other in charge in the rear  
as is the custom, and they started for  
the school.

After going a short distance Mc-  
Millan turned thirty rounds to call  
Mr. Pratt and notify him that the  
boys had been found. Upon ap-  
proaching to glance at the boys Ladd  
was taking possession of him with  
a .32 caliber revolver. McMillan  
threw his hands up and took a shoun-  
ing posture, apparently disconcerting  
Ladd, who fired, the bullet striking  
the left posterior and lodging just  
above the knee. The wounded man  
bent to the ground but immediately  
they continued to run, knowing that  
the shot had taken effect though Mc-  
Millan tried to conceal the fact. The  
assistant superintendent was sum-  
moned to his assistance and placed  
him in a cart and took him to the  
office of Dr. F. C. Phelps where the  
bullet was removed.

The search was again renewed by  
Pratt and other officers and the boys  
located near English's barn about  
a mile from the corner of the shooting.  
With small show of resistance they  
gave themselves up and were taken  
back to the school and later in the  
evening the two other boys were  
placed in the city jail and the young-  
est led back to the school house.

Edward Sorrell of Burlington, aged  
about 20 years, was the instigator of  
the escape and stole the revolver with  
which the shooting was done from  
night watchman Arnold's room.  
It was his aim that gave the wound  
to Ladd while McMillan's back was  
turned and persuaded him to  
shoot. It is believed that if McMillan  
had not turned his back he did not  
immediately after representing them  
and giving them just the opportunity  
to fire that they desired, the boys  
would have powerfully returned to the  
school, though when questioned con-  
cerning the affair they acknowledged  
their intention of shooting the first  
officer attempting their capture. Ed-  
ward Sorrell was first acknowledged  
guilty and upon him is placed the  
most blame.

Thursday the boys were taken to  
Middlebury by officer Pratt to be ex-  
amined by State Attorney E. C.  
Hoswell, and after considering the  
case it was decided to send the pris-  
oners to the House of Correction at Rut-  
land to serve out the alternate sen-  
tence imposed upon them when they  
were committed to the industrial  
school. Ladd was sent to the work-  
house at Rutland out from two to two  
and one half years and Sorrell's sen-  
tence was 15 days in the same insti-  
tution.

Friday morning Mr. McMillan was  
taken to the Mary Fletcher hos-  
pital, Burlington, where with the  
careful and proper care afforded  
at the hospital it is thought the  
injury will not prove serious if other  
complications are avoided. The  
last reports of his condition were very  
favorable and his recuperative power  
greater than could have been expected.  
The recovery from the wound took  
about three weeks, of which the last  
three years being which time he has  
made many friends in Vergennes, who  
expressed their sympathy and wish him a  
speedy recovery.

Wednesday morning he received  
the bullet removed from the hospital  
and that he was allowed to sit up  
for a short time Tuesday.
