who is reportedly going back to gentleman farming when his term is over.

""Talmadge has fought the New Deal projects on the grounds that Negroes are getting too much and piling up a large debt on the State of Georgia," Mr. Coles, who was in the state all during the pre-primary campaign said."

He discovered also that

"In Jacksonville, Negroes have already gotten a new high school and have had a number of their race placed as nurses and teachers on WPA projects, and also as relief investigators.

"In almost every city, when the WPA and other Federal emergency works started, there was discrepancy in pay," Mr. Coles' investigations show.
"But where Negroes had the courage to bring these inadequacies to the attention of the National government, steps were taken to remedy the matter, and in most instances, they have been remedied.

"In some cities Negroes were not getting any emergency work. Such a city was Gretna, in Jefferson Parish. All the jobs were given to whites, but while some Negroes fumed, others mrote to Washington, and the words came back along the line that emergency public works was intended for Negroes also. Negroes were forthwith employed.

**In Algiers, again in Louisiana, I was told WPA teachers are getting \$1 an hour, and that where they have dependents they are given from 115 to 125 hours a month, just as the white teachers are getting. Until Washington was notified of discrepancies, however, Negroes were limited to eighty or ninety hours a month.

"The fact that Negroes are getting job opportunities that they have never had before, that they are getting much needed schools and hospitals, and that they get an ear when they sand pleas to Washington to be treated like all other American citizens, is the reason they are so wholly behind the New Deal and Mr. Roosevelt"

"Turning from prospects of the Presidential campaign, Mr. Coles told of some of his other experiences. He found a Negro, Joseph Bartholomew, who has built nearly all the golf courses in Louisiana and who now has a contract from the city to build course made possible by WPA funds. Mr. Bartholomew has taught a considerable number of white Louisianans the game...."
