Trailing 1-0 going into the third period, the Panthers were ready to make amends. Junior Debbie Gow netted a strong shot over the shoulder of the UVM goalie to tie the game with 11 minutes left. On the same shift, her line mate, senior Marci Griffith, put the Panthers ahead with her strong play and perseverance around the opposition's goal. Her goal would be the final one of the game as Middlebury skated off with its first victory in as many games.

Hoping to please the hometown crowd in their home opener Middlebury set out to beat Williams on December 3. During the first period, Middlebury jumped out to a 3-0 lead with goals from team captain Sam Chapin '89, Debbie Gow, and rookie sophomore Lynelle Preston.

In the second period, however, the Middlebury offense was held scoreless despite their twenty shots on goal. The final score was 4-0 with Suzi Black '89 and Kristen Gustavson '91 combining for the Middlebury shutout.

On December 9, Middlebury enjoyed its third victory against no losses, as they handily beat Hamilton, 7-3. Although Middlebury dominated from the outset, the weaker Hamilton team was able to ward off the Panther attack in front of their net and hold them to only two goals in the first period. Cynthia White and Marci Griffith provided offensive support with one goal apiece. Hamilton was able to score a goal of their own in that period and the second period began with Middlebury leading by a slim 2-1 margin.
